#### 1. <u>Welcome and Introductions:</u>

Welcome and introduction were done. No members of the public were in attendance.

#### 2. <u>Minutes of Board Meeting – January 17, 2024:</u>

Motion to approve the January 17, 2024, Board Meeting minutes, as written, was made by Trustee Rivera and seconded by Trustee Lord. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

#### 3. <u>Financial Information:</u>

#### A. <u>Review Mt. Olympus Payables and Disbursements:</u>

An explanation was given by Assistant GM Rohwer for the amount listed for the Payroll on 1/14/24. This amount is the result of compensating the previous General Manager for his accrued vacation and sick time at the time of his retirement. Assistant GM Rohwer also explained that there was an error in printing checks that caused a number of checks to be voided as the check number cannot be reused.

After review and discussion, a motion to approve the Mt. Olympus Payables and Disbursements was made by Trustee Lord and seconded by Trustee Rivera. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

#### B. <u>Review Central Valley Invoice:</u>

Assistant GM Rohwer explained that the invoice amount is still high as Central Valley pays for insurance at the first of the year, approximately \$800k.

After review and discussion, a motion to approve the Central Valley Invoice for \$1,191,877.34 was made by Trustee Lord and seconded by Trustee Rivera. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

#### C. <u>Review Financial Report:</u>

Trustee Lord asked about the six trucks assigned to the Engineering & Inspection department. Assistant GM Rohwer explained that there are four individuals in that department, and each has a truck assigned to them. The remaining two trucks belong to another department (Lines) and need to be reassigned on the ledger sheets. Assistant GM Rohwer also noted that the District is currently trying to sell two surplus vehicles. A 2015 Ford F-150 and a 2005 International Wate Truck. The bid period closed on February 21, 2024, for both vehicles and the District did not receive a single bid. Assistant GM Rohwer will repost the vehicles and may drop the "purchase now" price by \$1,000.00. Assistant GM Rohwer may be asking the Board for approval to reduce the price further in a subsequent board meeting.

Trustee Lord asked about the \$0.00 dollar amounts shown under the Central Valley ledger page. Assistant GM Rohwer explained that Central Valley invoicing is always one month behind. Amounts will show up in the next financial report.

After review and discussion, the Financial Report was accepted for filing by the Board Members.

#### 4. <u>Central Valley (CV) Report – Trustee Lord:</u>

No discussion on the January 24, 2024, CV board meeting.

- A. Entity Managers Meeting Report (Feb. 7, 2024) GM Demke:
  - Finance: CV year end closeout for 2023 should be completed by February 9, 2024.
  - Work on the annual audit has started and the auditors will be on-site February 20<sup>th</sup> through the 22<sup>nd</sup>. Justin indicated that they may need to make some ledger adjustments based on GASB 96 for any subscription-based software agreement that spans multiple years.
  - The audit numbers should be available to the member entities by mid-March.
  - CV is still waiting for one more refund check from the insurance company regarding Builder's Risk. This refund is for buildings that have been removed from the Builder's Risk policy and placed on the General Policy before the term of the policy expires.
  - CV still needs to obtain a Builder's Risk policy for the Dewatering Building project. The amount of this policy will be approximately \$249,000±.
  - West Weber Inland Port / Marriot Disposal Site: Phil displayed a map showing the boundaries of the proposed West Weber Inland Port and the Marriot Disposal Site. Most of CV disposal area resides inside of the proposed Inland Port. Based on discussion with the property owner, it appears that they will be accepting biosolids for the next five to ten years. This is not guaranteed. CV will need to identify future disposal sites to possibly replace the Marriot site. Treatment facilities should have a minimum of two disposal options. CV currently has two, the Marriot site and the Fairfield site.
  - Fairfield Property: CV would like to start land applying biosolids to the site soon to solidify the use of the property as a land application site. This will require some infrastructure to be built on the site. This may include a building to store equipment as well as roadways and/or berms. Phil indicated that there may be a closed session at the next board meeting to discuss upcoming issues regarding the site.
  - Air Quality: CV is currently working on obtaining an air quality permit to operate their emergency standby generators. The application has been submitted to the State. CV is waiting on the approval of the application.

Bryan reported that the annual air inventories for the facility are due to the State by April.

There was also a discussion regarding arrent methane emissions from WRRF's (treatment plants). NASA has a satellite that is capable of photographing methane emissions. This is public data and environmental groups are now using this data to track emissions. A floating cover digester can and does emit methane around the perimeter of the tank and through the safety pressure relief valves.

#### - BNR Project Updates:

 Side Stream Nitrogen – Started the 30-day functional test on reactor 1. Reactor 2 will not be operational until 2025 due to electrical procurement issues.

- Side Stream Phosphorus Completing building punchlist items. Approximately \$150,000 left in the contract.
- Blower Building Occupancy mid-summer of 2024. Blower startup late 3rd quarter of 2024.
- Thickening and Straining Building The factory acceptance testing has been completed for the centrifuges. The centrifuges are in the process of being shipped to CV.
- Electrical Building The brick work does not meet the specifications for installation and will need to be removed and redone at the contractor's expense.
- Asset Management: The quarterly calibration for the entity's flow meters occurred on February 13<sup>th</sup>. Line Superintendent Stevens was present for the calibration on both flow meters. No issues were found.

CV has now met with all the member entities regarding ownership of the interceptors feeding the facility. CV will now craft a Memorandum of Understanding documenting who is responsible for what.

- Clarifier Launders: Stainless Steel purchase award (Board approval in Feb). CV will be purchasing stainless steel to fabricate new launders and structure for two clarifiers. The cost for the primary clarifier is \$236,000, and the cost of the secondary clarifier is \$265,000. The facility has ten primary clarifiers and twelve secondary clarifiers. The fabrication work is all completed in house. Doing the work in this manner has been a cost savings to the facility. To replace the same items from the manufacturer would be an additional cost of \$500k. CV will be completing two clarifiers each year until all the units have been updated.
- Compost Tarp Winder: CV needs to replace the compost tarp winder. This machine covers and removes the tarps from the compost piles. Seeking Board approval in Feb for \$249,000. \$5,000 over budget.
- Tunnel HVAC: CV is currently upgrading the HVAC equipment that supplies conditioned air to the underground tunnel system. One unit has been completed. The remaining two units should be upgraded by mid-summer.
- **Influent Pump No. 5:** The factory test on Influent Pump No. 5 has been completed and the pump is being shipped back to CV.
- Next CV Board Meeting: February 28, 2024. There is a strategy session at 1:00 p.m. with the board meeting following at 3:00 p.m.

Trustee Rivera asked for the names of the sponsors for some of the proposed bills. District Clerk Gonzales was able to give Trustee Rivera the names. The sponsors names are also shown on the Legislative Update PDF file given to the Board.

Trustee Rivera also asked about contacting members of the legislature that she personally has a relationship with. She asked if that was appropriate for a board member to voice an opinion on a bill as a board member representing a district. GM Demke was not sure of an answer to Trustee Rivera's question and stated as such. GM Demke said he would contact UASD to see what an appropriate response would be.

#### 6. <u>Policy Discussion:</u>

#### A. <u>MTOID Web Site Privacy Statement:</u>

GM Demke received an email on January 30<sup>th</sup> stating MTOID does not have a properly published privacy policy statement, which is required by Utah code 63-D-2-S103. <u>stateauditor@utah.gov</u>. The email also stated that the District needs to publish a policy by April 30<sup>th</sup> and that the State Auditor will be checking the website during the month of May. This is a new requirement. Assistant GM Rohwer indicated that the State's information was made available the second week of January. Assistant GM Rohwer crafted a policy (shown below) based on the State's Privacy Policy template.

#### B. <u>Draft Travel Policy:</u>

The District has prepared a travel policy for the District. Prior to this policy, the District followed the State's travel policy. The proposed policy used the USAD Travel Policy template and was modified to fit the District's needs. Trustee Lord asked about the travel distance contained in Section D.7. This is the distance a person travels without the need for lodging. The distance shown in the policy is 50 miles. This basically covers the Wasatch Front. Anything outside of this allows for the traveler to receive reimbursement for lodging. The policy allows for the Board or the GM to provide an exception to this if it is in the best interest of the District. Additionally, the Board may change the policy at their discretion.

After review and discussion, a motion to approve the MTOID Travel Policy as presented was made by Trustee Rivera and seconded by Trustee Lord. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

C. Draft MTOID Employment Policies Manual:

The District is in the process of reviewing and updating the Employment Policies Manual. Legal counsel has reviewed the document and the proposed changes. Staff felt that the manual also needed to be reviewed by an HR specialist. This HR review is currently underway. Due to this, GM Demke has recommended waiting to review and approve the full manual with one exception. Proposed Section 23.4 – Paid Parental and Postpartum Leave (shown below). The District has an employee that will qualify for this benefit within the next few weeks. The District's philosophy is to support our staff and their families. This policy is a great benefit for those that qualify. Trustee Lord asked if this

> would place a hard ship on the remaining staff. GM Demke answered yes, others will need to pick up the slack during any leave. We as leadership are confident that we can cover any requested leave that may come about. We have another individual in the front office, with the new controller. If needed, GM Demke is qualified and licensed to operate the large trucks. Leadership feels the benefit to the employees far out way the cost and a short inconvenience.

#### 23.4. PAID PARENTAL AND POSTPARTUM LEAVE

Paid Parental & Postpartum Leave is intended to provide a supportive and flexible framework for employees experiencing the joy of welcoming a new child into their family. It aligns with our commitment to fostering a positive work-life balance and supporting the well-being of our employees. The District is committed to supporting our employees during significant life events, such as the birth or adoption of a child. This section outlines the leave entitlements for eligible employees in such situations.

- A. Eligibility Criteria: All regular full-time employees who have been employed by the District for at least six continuous months of service are eligible for Parental & Postpartum Leave.
- B. Leave Entitlements:
  - 1. Mother's Leave (Postpartum/maternity): Eligible mothers are entitled to take up to 12 weeks of Parental & Postpartum leave following the birth or adoption of a child.
  - 2. Father's or Legal Spouse's Leave (Parental): Eligible fathers or legal spouses are entitled to take up to 2 weeks of Parental leave following the birth or adoption of a child.
- C. Leave Approval: Employees must provide at least two weeks' notice prior to the intended start date of their Parental & Postpartum leave when reasonably possible. Their leave request should be submitted to the employee's department head, along with any required documentation stating the upcoming birth or adoption date.
- D. Intermittent Leave: Normally, Parental and Postpartum leave is taken consecutively, but if arrangements are made with your department head beforehand and you reach a mutual written agreement. Leave may be broken up into two segments within the first two months after the birth or adoption.
- E. Benefits During Leave: During approved Parental & Postpartum Leave, employees will maintain their health benefits. The employee's share of the health premium will be deducted from the paycheck as usual.
- F. Return to Work:
  - 1. Employees are expected to return to work on the agreed-upon date at the end of their Parental & Postpartum leave.
  - 2. Failure to return to work may result in the employee being required to repay the employer's share of health premiums paid during the leave period.
- G. Job Protection: Parental & Postpartum Leave is protected under applicable state & federal laws. The District will make reasonable efforts to reinstate employees to their previous position or an equivalent position upon their return from leave.

After review and discussion, a motion to approve only Section 23.4 – Paid Parental and Postpartum Leave of the MTOID Employment Policies Manual as presented was made by Trustee Rivera and seconded by Trustee Lord. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

#### 7. <u>Manager's Report:</u>

#### A. <u>Personnel Review:</u>

GM Demke reported that we have four employees with anniversary dates in February.

- Darren Stone 2/3/97 27 years
- Cody Sommerville 2/18/97 27 years
- Boyd Frandsen 2/27/23 1 year
- Misty Burke 2/24/22 2 years

Mr. Jaydon Larsen was rehired and started back with the District on February 12<sup>th</sup> in the Lines Department. The District is currently down one FTE in the Lines Department. Assistant GM Rohwer indicated that we currently have three applications on file for the position. All three applicants are people that are known by District staff. We will start the interview process the first part of March.

#### B. <u>Operations Report:</u>

Holladay City: GM Demke received an email from Mr. Jared Bunch, Holladay City's Engineer reporting issues with twelve manhole covers located along Holladay Boulevard. District staff have inspected each manhole frame and cover that was listed in the email. Staff paid particular attention to the dimensions of the cover with regards to the frame lip height as well as checking for a stable fit of the cover. Staff have replaced any covers that did not meet the manufacture's fabrication dimensions or "rocked" in the frame. GM Demke responded to Ms. Gina Chamness stating what was done and copied Mr. Jared Bunch. We are working to rebuild our working relationship with the City.

#### - Callout / Backups:

- On February 2nd, staff received a call out from the Apello system reporting a broken manhole cover @ 2916 East Brooke Burn Rd. Staff responded and found a broken cover that had fallen into the manhole (C79-19). The broken cover was retrieved, and a new cover installed. The work required a Permit Required Confined Space Entry. No damage was done to any vehicles.
- On February 17th, staff received a call out from the Apello system reporting that the road is sinking @ 4016 South Mercury Drive (Millcreek City) but they can't find any water. Think it might be a sewer issue. Line was last inspected on April 5, 2022. No indications of infiltration or grit. This appears to be an issue with a water service line repair and a contractor that did not backfill the excavation properly. Trustee Rivera asked who we are following up with. GM Demke stated that it would be Millcreek City and that he would follow up if necessary.
- On February 15th, the jet cleaning crew was cleaning the 8" line in Orchard Dr. and had the water pressure set too high on the hose reel. When pulling the hose back the

high pressure caused a toilet blowout at 1923 East Orchard Dr. This blowout affected 3 bathrooms and some carpeted areas. The owner Julie Black was very concerned about the incident. Engineer Ayala responded to the site under GM Demke's direction and discussed what had happened and why. Based on what happened, GM Demke authorized the payment of cleaning costs up to \$1,100.00 based on cleaning receipts.

- On February 16th, the cleaning crew was pulling heavy amounts of grit from the line in Miller Ave. During this process, the hose became stuck. The operator increased the water pressure to free the hose and caused a toilet blowout at 1297 East Miller Ave. (Amari Salone & Spa). This area has heavy construction happening on both sides of Miller Ave. We believe this is where the extra grit is coming from. Line Superintendent Stevens spoke with the owner and explained what happened. The owner already had the water cleaned up prior to his arrival. No damage was done and there are no costs associated with this at this time.
- i) Bid Results for 2024 Lining Project:

On February 14, 2024, bids were publicly opened at the District's office for the 2024 Lining Project. Four bids were received:

Inliner	\$845,765.00
Insituform	\$769,502.65
Iron Horse	\$1,481,309.00
PEC	\$798,950.00

Staff have prepared a memo detailing their recommendation regarding the contractor to award the contract to. The decision is based on the following:

- Insituform last performed work for the District in 2016. The punch list was NOT completed from this work.
- Six entities were contacted for references. All six indicated issues when working with Insituform.
- The Bid documents allow awarding on experience, references, availability, and cost.

Based on the minimal price difference and past experience, staff is recommending awarding the contract to **PEC**. Trustee Lord asked if the contractors were present for the bid opening. GM Demke indicated that they were. GM Demke is aware that there may be protest and is prepared to defend the decision.

After review and discussion, a motion to approve the award of the 2024 Lining Project to PEC at a bid price of \$798,950.00 to PEC based on staff recommendation was made by Trustee Lord and seconded by Trustee Rivera. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

#### C. <u>WWETT Conference Report:</u>

GM Demke, Lines Superintendent Stevens, and Line Worker Edgington attended the WWETT Conference in Indianapolis during the month of January. GM Demke indicated that the first day was worth the trip and the remaining days were not worth attending. In the future, the District will not attend this conference unless we will be purchasing a large piece of sewer equipment. Lines Superintendent Stevens stated that he agreed with GM Demke's opinion. Trustee Lord asked which conference GM Demke would recommend attending. GM Demke stated that WEFTech is the preferred conference as of now.

#### D. <u>Upcoming Conferences:</u>

GM Demke asked the board members if there is interest from the Board Members in attending either the WEF Collections Conference in Harford, CT on April 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> or the WEAU Annual Conference in St. George, UT on April 23<sup>rd</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup>. Trustee Lord, Trustee Neff, and Trustee Rivera will not be attending the WEF Collections Conference. GM Demke will be attending the WEF Collections Conference. Trustee Neff will not be attending the WEAU Annual Conference. GM Demke will be attending the WEAU Annual Conference. Waiting on Trustee Lord and Trustee Rivera on a decision on the WEAU Annual Conference. Also noted was Assistant GM Rohwer and Controller Eppich will be attending the UGFOA Conference in St. George UT on April 8<sup>th</sup> through the 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### 1. <u>Welcome and Introductions:</u>

Welcome and introductions were done. No members of the public were in attendance.

#### 2. <u>Mt. Olympus Improvement District:</u>

#### A. Brief History of the District:

As the District board is now made up of individuals with differing levels of service, from eight years to two months, GM Demke started with a brief introduction to the Mt. Olympus Improvement District (MTOID or District) and what we do as a District.

The District itself was founded in 1946. Our service area includes the majority of Millcreek City and Holladay City as well as portions of unincorporated Salt Lake County and Murray City, and approximately half of the City of South Salt Lake. The District provides sewer collection service to a population of about 164,800. The District currently has an investment in capital assets of just over \$15 million at the end of 2023 as well as an investment in the Central Valley Water Reclamation Facility (CV) of just over \$42 million. CV is the treatment plant where the wastewater is treated.

A map was presented showing the extent of the Districts service area with the associated sewer pipes that are maintained. The service area is from 2700 South on the north end to approximately 6900 South / Canuteson's Corner on the south end and from Mt. Olympus Cove on the east to 1100 West on the west side. It is a big portion of Salt Lake County.

Currently, the District has 393 miles of pipe in the ground. That is 2,077,000 feet of pipe that is maintained by District staff. Just for reference, from here to St. George is about 320 miles. The District also has 9,522 manholes that are also maintained. Sewer lengths per City are as follows: Murray City has 6.7 miles, Cottonwood has 0.99 miles, Holladay City has 122 miles, Millcreek has 205 miles, Salt Lake County 2.3, and South Salt Lake 55 miles. The District has a single lift station that was rebuilt with new pumps about five months ago. The lift station is located on 1100 West and approximately 3200 South.

Trustee Lord asked if the District encompasses all of Millcreek City? No, we do not encompass all of Millcreek. Millcreek City has a few areas that discharge to Salt Lake City. Trustee Lord also asked about Holladay City. Again, the District does not service all of Holladay City. Trustee Neff stated that Cottonwood Improvement District services the portion of Holladay City that is not serviced by MTOID.

GM Demke spoke about the mobile assets. This is the equipment that staff uses to keep the sewer system running. The District has three combination trucks, two currently in service with the third truck due to be delivered in about two months. The combination trucks are configured with a hydro-jetter cleaning system and a high-volume vacuum system. The District also has one hydro-jetter cleaning truck and a 3,500-gallon water tender to refill the cleaning trucks in the field. The District has two closed circuit television (CCTV) inspection vans as well as multiple light duty trucks. There are three buildings on site that house the Administration group, the Lines department and a vehicle shop.

Pictures of each of the heavy-duty trucks were shown. These include a 2015 Freightliner Vac Con combination unit and the newest combination unit a 2021 Western Star Vac Con, this is our recycler. Both of these trucks require water to operate. They are hydro-jetters. The cleaning system uses high pressure water or a water jet. Without water, they cannot clean, so both trucks have on board water storage tanks. The "recycler" truck has the capability of recycling water from the sewer to provide water for cleaning. The "recycler" works very well for cleaning pipes 12 inches in diameter and larger as these pipes need large amounts of water due to larger diameters.

The District has ordered a third combination truck. This will be another Vac Con and it is scheduled to be delivered towards the end of April this year. GM Demke then gave an explanation of the two CCTV vans and how they operate.

The District has an asset that is extremely valuable, and that's our people. We have 26 FTE's. A copy of the District's current organization chart was shown. We have 14 people in our Lines department, 4 people in our Engineering/Blue Stakes group, 3 people in Secretarial/Controller group. Asst. General Manager Rohwer, General Manager Demke, and Executive Secretary Gonzales rounds out the group. Trustee Lord asked which department the one FTE was short on? GM Demke stated it is in our Lines department.

These are the people and the equipment that keeps this sewer system running.

#### B. <u>Current Operation:</u>

As stated above, there is currently 393 miles of pipe that needs to be maintained. Trustee Neff asked how often the District is getting through all those lines? What's the plan? GM Demke stated as of now, staff is either cleaning or inspecting the system every 12 to 18 months.

GM Demke stated he is currently reviewing this requirement and may be making changes to this time frame. Staff may be inspecting pipes that don't need to be inspected and cleaning pipes that don't need to be cleaned. This is a wasted effort. New properly installed pipes may only need to be cleaned once every 3 years and inspected every 5 years. GM Demke stated that he is currently reviewing and updating the Sewer System Management Plan (SSMP) to conform to EPA recommendations and best management practices for cleaning and inspecting of sewer lines. Once the updates are completed, GM Demke will present the SSMP to the Board for review and then adoption.

#### 3. Discussion on Administrative Policy & Procedures Manual:

#### A. <u>Mission Statement:</u>

A copy of the Mission Statement was provided for Board review. GM Demke then discussed how we meet that statement.

#### B. <u>General Guidelines:</u>

GM Demke stated he pulled information for this meeting from the Little Manual for Local and Special Service Districts from the UASD.

- i) The Board was presented with two definitions. The first was Governing Body. The Governing Body refers to the Board of Trustees of the District. The second was Management. Management Refers to those responsible for implementation, which generally includes executive management, management, and in some cases, department heads or other supervisors.
- ii) GM Demke explained to the Board that The Governing Body sets broad policy, and the General Manager directs operations.
- iii) Limitations of the Board. Chapter 1, Paragraph 6 from the MTOID Administrative Policy and Procedures Manual states:

"Individual trustees shall not give orders to any staff member or general manager either publicly or privately but may make suggestions and recommendations to the general manager".

> iv) State law state that Governing Bodies or Boards are required to appoint a Board Chair which is currently Trustee Ami Neff, a Board Clerk which is Tammy Gonzales, who is also our Executive Secretary, and a Treasurer, which is Assistant GM/CFO Stephen Rohwer. GM Demke is also able to fill in as Treasurer if needed.

#### C. <u>Board Meetings:</u>

As a Board we have to hold meetings. The Open Meetings Act governs these meetings. It should be noted that this section of Utah Code is currently being modified by the legislature and the changes may become law if passed in this session. Utah Code Title 52 Chapter 4 defines two types of meetings:

- **Closed to the Public Meeting** A meeting that the public is not allowed to attend, pursuant to the Open Meetings Act. There are seven items that can be discussed in a Closed Meeting. Anything outside of that must be in an Open Meeting.
- **Open to the Public Meeting** A meeting that the public is allowed to attend, pursuant to the Open Meetings Act. Currently the law allows public comment at the discretion of the Board Chair.
  - The following are different types of Open Meetings:
    - Regular Board Meeting A regularly scheduled meeting of the Board for which notice of date, time and place has been given in the Annual Meeting schedule.
    - Special Meeting Any meeting of the Board that replaces or is held in addition to regular meetings. The Board Chair can call for a special meeting if needed. If something arises that needs to be discussed prior to a Regular Board Meeting, the Board Chair can call a special meeting. 24-hour public notice is required with one possible exception, an emergency meeting, and that requires the best notice practicable prior to the meeting.
    - Annual Board Meeting At this meeting officers of the District are elected. The Annual Meeting shall be held on the date and hour of its regularly scheduled meeting in January.
    - Emergency Meeting A special meeting held as a result of unforeseen circumstances, to consider matters of an urgent or emergency nature. The best notice practicable prior to the meeting is required and an attempt to notify all members of the Board must be made. Salt Lake City had an earthquake in 2020. That's an emergency, a major collapse of a line and the District needs to respond, that's an emergency. Trustee Lord asked if we have authorized management to spend up to a stated amount during an emergency? GM Demke stated yes, the amounts are listed in our purchasing policy.
- Quorum: A Quorum is a majority of the members of the Trustees constitutes a quorum, in the District's case this would be two out of three. Majority vote of a quorum upon a matter which may be voted upon at a meeting shall be sufficient for the determination of those matters accepted/required otherwise by statute. No Trustee may appoint another individual, by proxy or otherwise, to assume the Trustee's responsibilities as a Trustee. A Trustee may not vote for or in place of another Trustee even with their consent.
- Closed Meetings The seven discussion categories for Closed Meetings are:
  - Discussion of the character, professional competence, or physical or mental health of an individual.
  - Strategy sessions to discuss collective bargaining.

- Strategy sessions to discuss pending or reasonably imminent litigation.
- Strategy sessions to discuss the purchase, exchange, or lease of real property when public discussion of the transaction would disclose the appraisal or estimated value of the property under consideration or prevent the District from completing the transaction on the best possible terms.
- Strategy sessions to discuss the sale of real property when: (a) public discussion of the transaction would disclose the appraisal or estimated value of the property under consideration or prevent the District from completing the transaction on the best possible terms; or (b) the District previously gave public notice that the property would be offered for sale; and (c) the terms of the sale are publicly disclosed before the District approves the sale.
- Discussion about deployment of security personnel, devices, or systems.
- Investigative proceedings regarding allegations of criminal misconduct.

The Board cannot take action in a Closed Meeting. No ordinance resolution, rule, regulation, contract, or appointment shall be approved in a Closed Meeting. This must be done in an Open Meeting.

- As a Board Member you have some responsibilities. Discussion of matters that concern the
  District cannot be discussed by the Board Members outside of the meetings discussed above.
  Board Members may discuss items that do not pertain to their board duties outside of a
  meeting. This is to ensure that the public is allowed to participate in the running of the District.
  Board Members may speak with management regarding informational items if needed, but no
  action may be taken outside of a meeting.
- D. <u>Board Responsibilities:</u>
  - i) Board Members are responsible for the following:
    - (1) Training State law requires that all Board Members receive initial training from the State Auditor's Office within one year of their appointment or election. Annual training is required regarding the procedures and requirements of Utah's open meeting laws. Trustee Neff and Trustee Lord attended the UASD training in November 2023. Trustee Rivera will have an opportunity to attend the training in November of 2024. It is highly recommended that the District Board Members attend the annual UASD conference. UASD provides all the required training for board members. A certificate of completion is issued to each attendee. Auditors will be looking for these certificates during an audit. If you cannot attend the conference, training is available online at the Utah State Auditor's website.
    - (2) As a Board Member you need to select and retain competent management.
    - (3) Establish with the general manager the District's long- and short-term goals. GM Demke stated that we are going to work on developing these goals over the next year with input from the Board.
    - (4) You need to monitor the operation. This is done every month by asking questions about the reports that are reviewed in the Board meetings. Stay informed of what's going on.
    - (5) You need to make sure that our meetings are conducted per state code.
    - (6) Board Members need to attend the board meetings. We have a policy that allows for having electronic meetings. If accommodations need to be made, please let management know as soon as possible.

(7) The Board's job is to supervise management. You establish District policies, and you monitor the implementation of those policies. You provide independent reviews. Your independent review of the financial statements meets this requirement. Asking questions is a must. The District will also complete an outside audit next month by Keddington & Christensen. It was noted that this is the last year of their contract. Another independent review is completed by outside legal counsel. The District is currently advertising for legal counsel now as we haven't updated the contract for many years. Our current legal counsel who has been with us for years has received a copy of the RFP as well as three others.

#### E. <u>District Administration:</u>

District administration, that's GM Demke's position which is appointed by the Board of Trustees. Administrative powers of the District are vested in and exercised by the general manager and the subordinate administrative officers. The powers and duties of the general manager are listed in Chapter 4, Paragraph 3 of the MTOID Administrative Policy and Procedures Manual.

#### 4. <u>General Board Goals for Administration Team – Open Discussion:</u>

GM Demke stated that he has now been here almost four months. He asked the Board Members to consider what they want to see for goals both long term and short term for the District.

- A. GM Demke stated that he is currently working on and updating the following:
  - i) Sewer System Maintenance Plan (SSMP).
  - ii) MTOID Employment Policies Manual. This is currently being reviewed by legal counsel and an HR specialist. GM Demke will have the updates ready for the March Board meeting to allow for Board discussion.
  - iii) MTOID updated the design standards a couple of years ago. GM Demke will be reviewing and adding some new language for road projects as well as large diameter pipeline requirements. This will include specifications for HOBOS pipe (fiberglass).
- B. The District will be conducting a salary survey this year. We are looking at job titles and classifications to make sure that they align with industry standards to allow us to compare like positions and not have to go find something to compare to. Trustee Lord asked when the last salary survey was done. Assistant GM Roher indicated that the last full survey was completed approximately five years ago.

#### 5. Open Discussion Items / Closing:

- A. Trustee Neff stated that she would like to see updates on the new I-15 trunk line project and to be updated on the lining projects.
- B. Trustee Neff asked what areas we as management are most worried about. GM Demke stated that the I-15 trunk line is a concern. The design of this truck line is under contract with Hansen Allen & Luce. GM Demke has put a temporary hold on the design because of UTA. UTA is proposing moving our existing trunk line on the east side of the rail line to allow for a double track in this location. Currently the District is scheduled to complete our work prior to UTA starting theirs. This means they will have to tear out all the new infrastructure that we just put in and redo it. GM Demke stated that we only want to do this work once. If the District can get UTA to help pay for some of this work while accommodating their needs, it would be a benefit. UTA is scheduled to have a design-build contract in place by April. Until that time, the project will be on hold. The next step for the District is to complete geotechnical borings. We have six sites that we need borings completed.

C. Trustee Lord asked that updated documents and/or policies should be presented to the board as draft documents to allow for a Board discussion. The adoption would not be part of the discussion and would happen at a later date. GM Demke stated that we can accommodate this request. It was also decided that Trustee Lord would be given a paper copy as well as having documents available in digital format.

There being no further information to come before the Board, a motion to adjourn was made by Trustee Lord and seconded by Trustee Rivera. The motion was approved by unanimous vote.

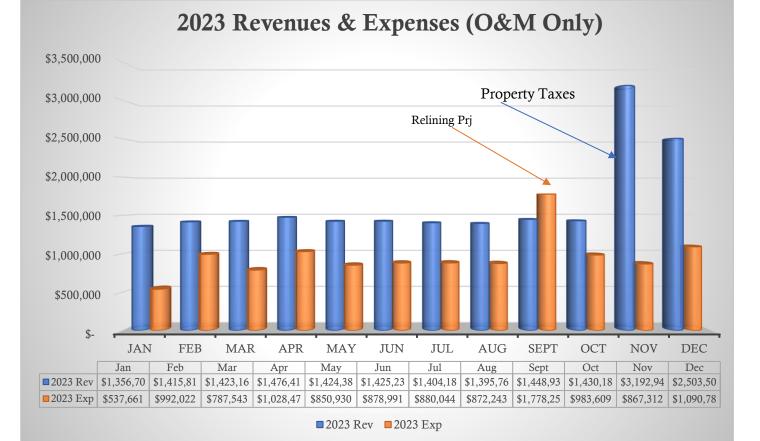

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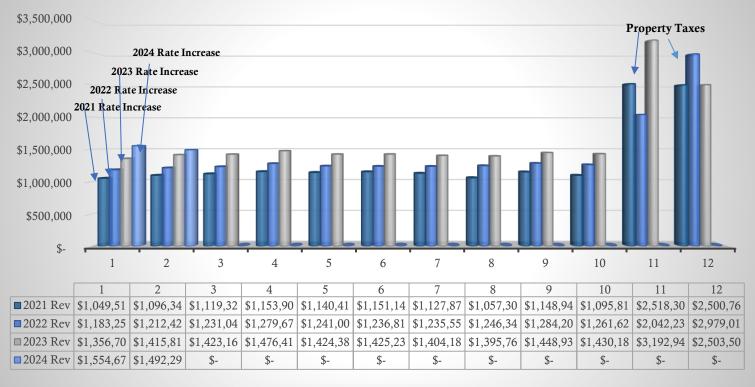
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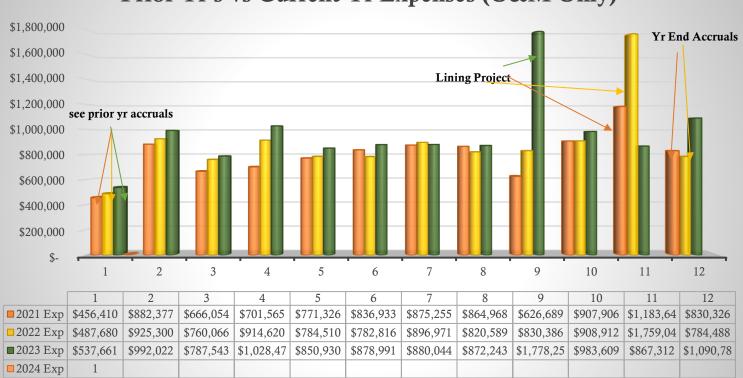
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### Prior Yr's vs Current Yr Revenues



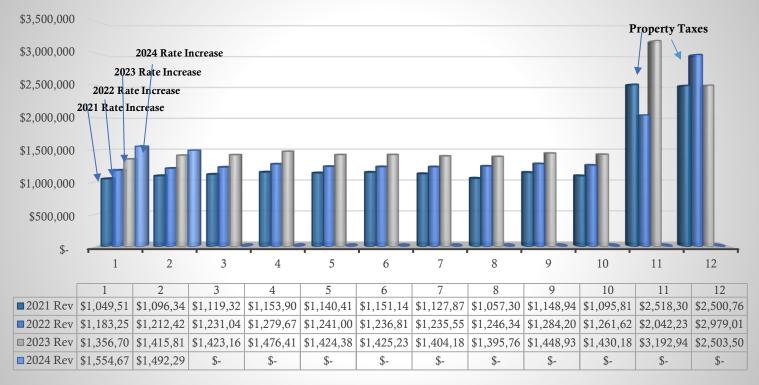

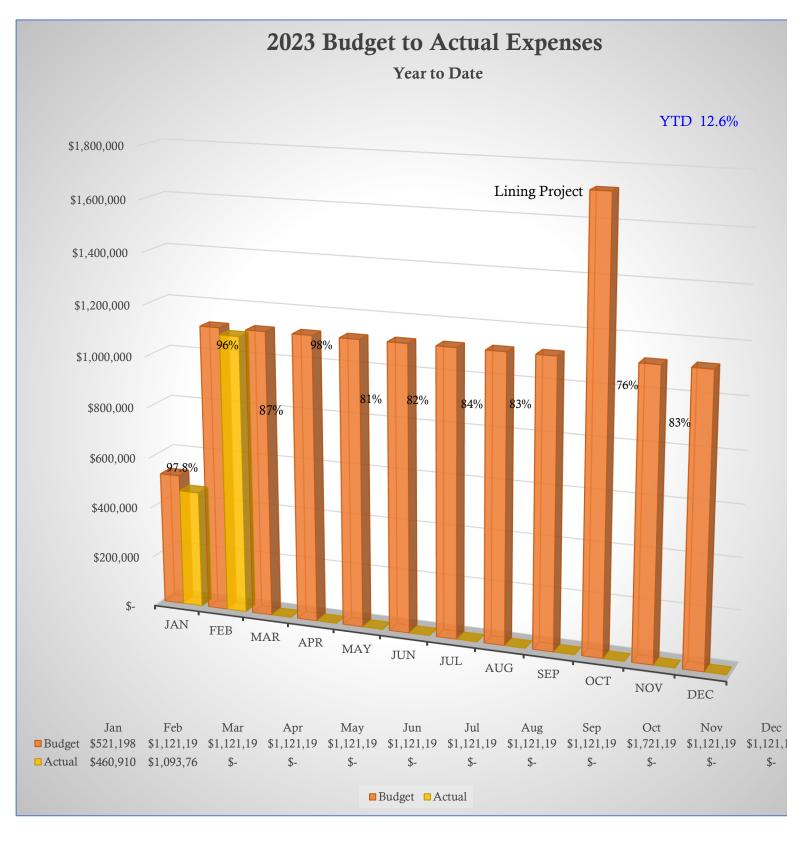
## Prior Yr's vs Current Yr Expenses (O&M Only)
